Executive Summary

Objectives

The Slum Children Literacy Project aims to achieve the following objectives:

- 2. Reduce the literacy gap by offering remedial support to children lagging behind in formal education.

Target Audience

Key Activities

- Strengthened educational infrastructure: Local teachers and volunteers will be better equipped to teach and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Sustainability Plan
